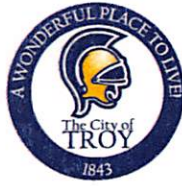

Troy Parks and Recreation is observing the following adjustment of facilities, programs and activities due to precautions of the COVID-19 virus.

- All baseball and softball teams will not be able to practice or play games beginning Wednesday, March 18, and we will tentatively resume practices on April 6.
- There will be no travel ball tournaments at the Troy Sportsplex until April 11.
- The Recreation Center has closed all facilities and suspended all activities, programs, exercise classes and meetings to the general public until April 6.
- The offices of the administrative staff will be closed until April 6.
- The coin-fed batting cages at the Troy Sportsplex are closed until April 11.
- The Underwater Easter Egg Hunt scheduled for April 3 has been cancelled.
- Pike County Lake remains open for normal business hours and operations.
- Murphree Park playground, the Troy Miracle League playground located at the Recreation Center, Washington Park Playground and Academy Street Playground are open, but all individuals and parents should be made aware that these playgrounds have many surfaces that cannot be sufficiently cleansed. Please use discretion.
- The outdoor walking trails at the Sportsplex and Murphree Park are open.

Troy Parks and Recreation and the City of Troy are monitoring this situation closely and adjustments in dates and times may be made as necessary.
